Dear CCR,

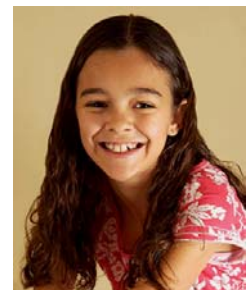

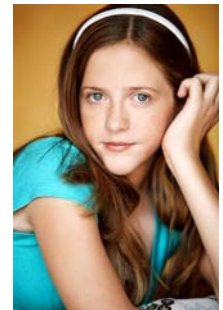
